


Purpose

We provide core services that focus on improving parenting skills, parent-child attachment, stress reduction and the development of coping skills that strengthen relationships.

How

1. Coordination of Services :

Referrals to agencies for families with children who live in the Brawley area. Service coordination includes case management carried through by a team of experts from various agencies such as , Imperial County Department of Social Services and Imperial County Behavioral Health Services, Imperial County Office of Education and Brawley Union High School.

2. Partnerships:

We have partnered with local service delivery agencies to bring resources to people in the area where they live. Through these partnerships we have on-site programs and community events that help to educate both parents and students.

3. To sign up:

Complete a Family Resource Center Referral form and bring it to the Center located in the campus of BUHS.

What we have to offer -

On-Site-Services:

Referrals and Case Management :

Social worker providing Case Management to students and their families.

Medi-Cal, Food Stamps, Cash Aid:

An eligibility worker available to process applications for Medi-Cal, cash aid and food stamps.

I.C Behavioral Health Drug and Alcohol Programs:

Counselor assists in the treatment of adolescent substance abuse in group sessions.

Anger Management Classes: Group counseling sessions for students in grades 9-12.

Parent Project @Program: Parent education program that focuses on youth issues and incorporates student involvement.

California School Age Families Program:

Program which serves expectant and parenting students and their children and aims to improve the educational experience, increase the availability of support services for students and provide child care and development services for their children.
